The NZMA Winter Throws Pentathlon Challenge will be held in the month of August this year. Once again this will also double as a Trans Tasman Challenge with Australian throwers.

WHAT DO YOU HAVE TO DO?

All you have to do is hold a Weight Pentathlon in the month of August, record the results on the enclosed sheets, and return this information to me. I am happy to accept scanned results via email to speed up the collation of results, and save on postage.

All results must be in my hands by the 9th September 2010 or earlier. I would appreciate a small write up and some photos of your event if possible, and I will use this information for the Vetline Article in the October issue.

When filling out the recording sheet could you please keep athletes in their age group order, as this saves a lot of time when inputting results into the computer.

I will then collate the results and send out certificates and full results to **all** competitors. It is therefore very important that all competitors print their names and addresses clearly on the address sheets, including state and postal code numbers. There has been a cost increase, set by NZMA executive, so the cost for 2010 will be \$10AUS/NZ per competitor to cover admin/postage/photocopying and certificates. The increase in price is to cover the huge rise in postage, paper and printing costs. Certificates are also being upgraded.

Entry Fees: \$10AUS/NZ

NEW ZEALAND: These can be paid by cheques made out to NZMA.
